1 Introduction

- 1.1 The NPPF defines Green Infrastructure as "a network of multi-functional green space, urban and rural, which is capable of delivering a wide range of environmental and quality of life benefits for local communities." The definition of Green Infrastructure is comprehensive and includes, among other features:
 - Footpaths, cycleways, bridleways, and any other PROW (Public Right of Way) within the green setting
 - Rivers, streams, canals and lakes in the urban area, and any other blue infrastructure within a green setting.
 - Playgrounds and sport fields.
 - Urban verges, groups of trees, lines of trees, and pocket greens.
 - Large woodlands, paddocks, and natural habitats on the outskirts of the urban environment.

- 1.2 Such a network provides several ecological services, for the benefit of both people and wildlife. The protection, as well as the enhancement and improvement, of such infrastructure is a key priority of the NPPF and for the social and environmental wellbeing of settlements.
- 1.3 The Oakham and Barleythorpe Steering Group have identified many Green Infrastructure elements in the Town and Parish that are important for the local community, and that should be protected through the Neighbourhood Plan.
- 1.4 This assessment presents information on the location of such infrastructure, a narrative description of why they are important, and photographs of the Green Infrastructure.
- 1.5 Policy Maps 9.1, 9.2, 9.3 and 9.4 shows the location of green infrastructure. For completeness, the maps show also Important Open Spaces, areas protected under Policy RLP43 of the RCC Local Plan Review. These areas already enjoy adequate protection under the Local Plan Review and therefore they have not been included in the Green Infrastructure Assessment.



The site on its northern perimeter is open on to Alsthorpe Road; to the east, it provides access to Tolethorpe Close via a footpath. The southern boundary is marked by a tree line and bushes behind which is a stream. To the east is a wooden fence which runs the length of the site next to Burley Park Way (Oakham bypass) and adjacent cycleway and footpath.

Barleythorpe Brook runs adjacent to a significant wooded area surrounding a pond.

It was identified as an essential community asset as part of the Neighbourhood Plan survey and in the walkabout.




Figure 1: Policy Map 9.1 of the Green Infrastructure sites in Oakham and Barleythorpe (NE)




Figure 2: Policy Map 9.2 of the Green Infrastructure sites in Oakham and Barleythorpe (SE)




Figure 3: Policy Map 9.4 of the Green Infrastructure sites in Oakham and Barleythorpe (SW)




Figure 4: Policy Map 9.4 of the Green Infrastructure sites in Oakham and Barleythorpe (NW)

4 Conclusion

- 4.1 In conclusion, the Green Infrastructures listed above should be protected as part of Policy 9 of the Oakham and Barleythorpe Neighbourhood Plan.
- 4.2 Development Proposals will need to consider the impact on such Green Infrastructures in the earliest phases of development and design of the site, and clearly demonstrate (through a design statement, if requested) how the layout, scale, massing, height, design, landscaping, etc. of the development do not have a detrimental impact on the Green Infrastructure or mitigate unavoidable implications.
- 4.3 The Green Infrastructures listed above will be subject to consultation as part of Regulation 14 Consultation on the Neighbourhood Plan.
